Forgiveness is a central thread running boldly through this Sunday's readings – in Genesis we find Joseph's brothers begging for forgiveness for their past misdemeanours; in Paul's letter to the Romans he implores his hearers not to judge others, and in the Gospel we hear a call to forgive not seven times but 'seventy-seven times'. There is an acknowledgement here that forgiveness is not easy, but is necessary, because there is mercy at the heart of God. Where forgiveness seems impossible, we must remember to leave judgement to God, who knows his creation more deeply than we do. *Sunday by Sunday, RSCM*
